DFF Kid's Fly Fishing Class, Past to Present

The Downey Fly Fishers started a Fly Tying Class 15 years ago at the Los Alamitos Youth Center. The classes were held on Saturday morning from 9:00 to 11:30 AM. The classes ran for about three years in Jan-Feb and around 12-18 students signed up for the class. Some of the instructors included Don Mayo, Brian Matthews, Zino Nakasuji, David Smith, John Adelote, Gary Worthen, Alan Grosdidier, Richard and Jim Dekker, Carl Laski, Brad Blancett and others. At the beginning of the class a video of Don Mayo was shown to the students tying the fly for the day. Members would show and demonstrate the different tools used to tie flies and each student received one on one instruction. The DFF was also involved in a class held at the Jonathon Jacques Cancer Center at Memorial Hospital of Long Beach. Although the students were suffering from a fatal disease, they looked forward to the class and the opportunity to spend some time doing something to occupy their minds and to relieve the stress of their radiation and surgical treatment.

One of the former students who attended one of our first tying classes was 10 year old Chris Keller. His primary teacher was Alan Grosdidier and Chris became one of the best tiers to ever take the class. He used to fish off of the jetty and surf in Seal Beach. Later, he fished off of the boats from Seal Beach pier. At the tender age of 22 Chris bought his first boat, got his captains license and now fishes commercially for tuna, yellowtail and also spear fishes. Last year, Chris gave an outstanding Power Point presentation to the Downey Club and proudly showed us his new boat and some awesome photos of huge albacore, tuna and yellowtail he and his friends caught. Chris is scheduled to give another presentation to the DFF in September, 2012.

Last month, another former student came in with his father for an appointment at my office. Easton Ito took our last class four years ago. He said he was doing a lot of fly fishing in Utah and caught a record carp that weighed 20 pounds. I told him I had never heard of such a large carp so his father showed some photos and video of his fish.

The best known teacher of fly fishing to kids is our own Frank Kuhn. Frank taught for many years at Arroyo High School in El Monte. Most of the students in his class were from low income families. I can remember driving to the club meeting with Don Mayo many times on a Friday night. We would pass the football field with

continued Ray... bright lights and band music going during the game. In a bungalow on the campus we came to Frank's class room filled with float tubes, fly fishing photos of kids fishing, and around 12-20 students, mostly Vietnamese, Cambodian, Hispanic and some Caucasians. To be a member of the club, Frank had a strict code where each student had to maintain a grade average of C or better. Before every meeting the students would cook some hot dogs or burgers and filled their plates with salad, chips and drank bottled water and soft drinks. The genuine love and respect shown to Frank by his students was a wonderful thing to see and experience. It reminded me of a famous statement by Reverend Martin Luther King Jr.:

"Not everyone can be famous, but anyone can be great...because greatness is measured by service to others(less fortunate)."

Another DFF member who is doing a great job with youth is Don Wakefield. An outstanding wrestler in his youth, Don is now the wrestling coach at Paramount High School where his team is ranked as one of the best in CIF. There is a good chance that some of the team members will be offered scholarships to major universities. Congratulations Don and to your team.

Thanks to members like Don and Frank for being dedicated teachers, mentors and role models to all of your students. During this time in our nation's history we need more people like members of the Downey Fly Fishers to help guide our youth. Our future is in their hands... *Please see pictures on page 6...*

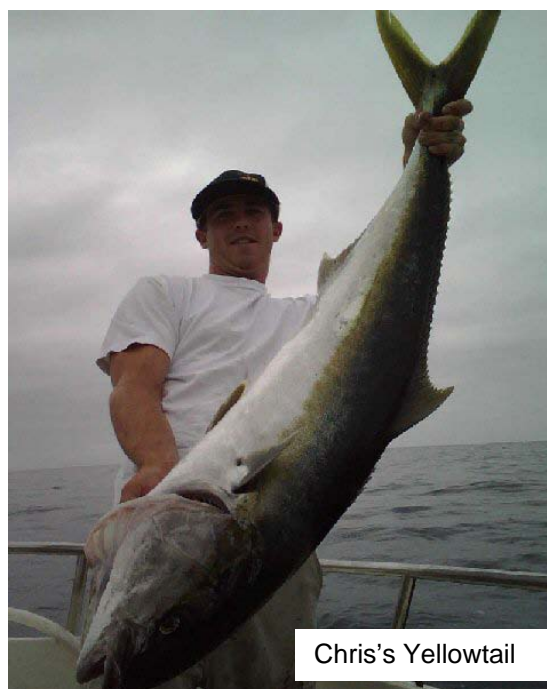

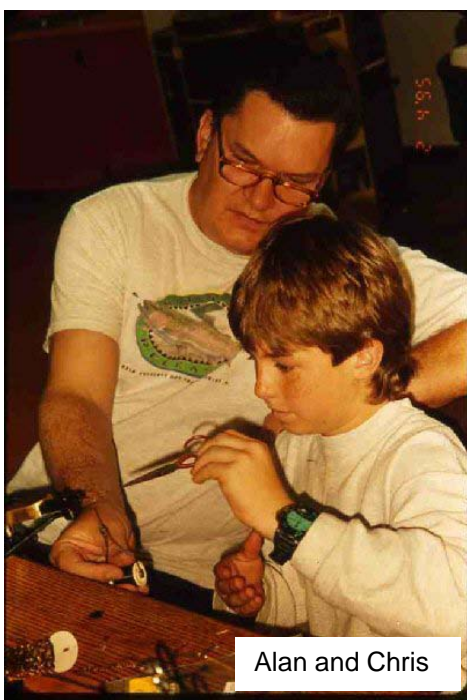

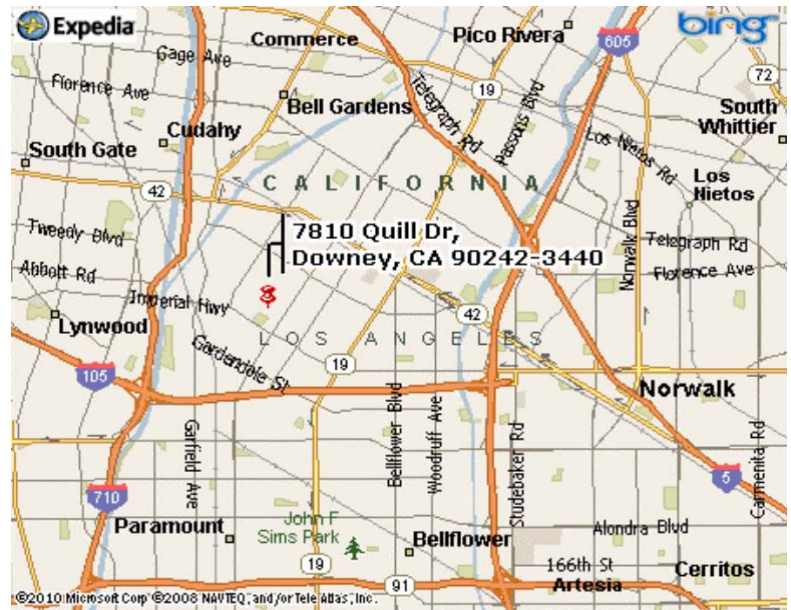
