

THE JOY OF FLYCASTING: TRICK CASTS With Michael Mauri

During the June 2019 meeting, we learned about entomology



(aquatic insects) in a simple and easy to understand approach. At the July 2019 meeting, we learn learned about fly casting problems and their solutions including open and tailing loop shapes, good timing, roll cast, curve casts, power application, creeping, push vs. pull through, last cast syndrome and many common casts.

At this month's meeting, we will learn about trick casts. You may ask, "Why do I need trick casts? I can also catch fish with my overhead cast." True, but those who manage the so-called trick casts will definitely have more chances to catch fish. This is not because the fish are so impressed by the elegant flight of the fly line that they immediately grab the fly. You catch more fish because you reach greater distances in difficulty water situations with the Switch Cast, Snap T, and other casts while also presenting your fly with greater precision. And each trick cast adds to the joy of fly fishing, as well as impresses your fishing buddy.
